Student in the Halls of Residence:

Important Notice

- 1. A student shall not obtain accommodation by fraudulent means.
- 2. A student shall not sell accommodation to another student.
- 3. A student shall not keep non-students in the room.
- 4. A student shall not harbor any squatters in the hall of residence or keep guest' and visitors in the rooms outside the official visiting hours which is Monday- Friday 5pm-7.30pm, weekends 2.30pm-7.30pm.
- 5. A student shall not molest, intimidate, harass or be rude to the University Officials.
- 6. A student shall not engage in theft or attempted theft, betting or gambling activities.
- 7. University rules forbid indecent behavior, these include but not limited to the following: Smoking Cigarettes, Weeds, cracks etc.
- 8. Clubbing, Battering, Bulling, Hooliganism and leaving the halls of residence sleeping out or travelling without authorization from the office of Students Affairs Director. attract stiff penalties that range from suspension to expulsion from the University.
- 9. Any student that leaves his/her water tap open while not in the room and allowing water to waste will pay N2000
- 10. Leaving on Fan/ AC and light in the hall of residence is an offence. Occupant/ defaulters will be fine N2000
- 11. A student shall not participate in any noisy act in the Halls of Residence.
- 12. A student shall not damage or destroy any University property.
- 13. A student shall not wash cloths on the passage and laundry is to be hung only in the designated drying areas.
- 14. Cooking is not allowed in the hall of Residence and the use of electrical cooking utensils are not allowed in the Halls of residence which include among others: Boiling Ring, Cooking Gas, Hot Plates, Electric Cooker, Microwave, Deep Freezer.

Any student caught using any of these cooking utensils will be penalized.

- 15. All students are expected to leave their Halls of Residence between the hours of 9am and 4 pm for lectures or library.
- 16. All students are expected to adhere strictly to the dress code of the university.
- 17. Indiscriminate discharging of human waste in an unauthorized place is not allowed.
- 18. On no account should labels, stickers or writing be placed/ pasted anywhere in the Halls of Residence, Defaulters would pay a fine of N5, 000.

- 19. A student shall not take away door keys during vacation or closure; keys should be handed over to the porter on the day of vacation.
- 20. Residents are advice not to keep large amount of money or valuables in their rooms, for security reasons. Residents are to lock all doors and windows each time they leave their rooms.
- 21. Residents are not to duplicate any keys issued by the hall porters.
- 22. A sum of money shall be charged for the loss of any key issued by the Hall Parent/ Porter. The amount will be determined by the kind of key.
- 23. Unauthorized entry to a room by means of a duplicated key is a serious offence. Offenders shall be seriously dealt with.
- 24. There is a movement book for all Residents to sign in and out of the halls.
- 25. Any student that wishes to stay a day or more after vacation date should write an official letter stating reasons why they want to stay longer, and directed to the office of the Director of Student Affairs.
- 26. The entrance gate of the hostels will be shut by 11pm.

Please Note

• Chapel Attendance is mandatory for ALL Christian Students, especially Christian Students in the Halls of Residence.

• No other Christian Fellowship/ religious gatherings are allowed on the campus besides those permitted by the Chaplaincy. Absence from Chapel services shall be with the written permission of the Director, Students & Corporate Affairs.

• Other programmes including: social gatherings, recreation in the cafeteria/eateries, lectures or sporting activities are not permitted during the period of Sunday Worship/service and related programmes.

• Students are expected to dress decently to the Chapel and conduct themselves decently during worship/ service.

• All students must obey and respect the official instructions from chapel officials e.g. Ushers, Sanctuary Keepers, Counselors etc.

• Students are advised to bring hard copies of the Holy Bible and notebook to the Chapel to record messages, testimonies and instructions during worship service.

Any act of misconduct in the chapel will be referred to the LCU Disciplinary Committee.
